## NEWS FROM THE 11<sup>TH</sup> WORLD SYMPOSIUM ON CHORAL MUSIC

The Barcelona Symposium is well under way. After the success of the call for performances (146 choir applications), the call for lectures has also exceeded our expectations with 165 applications, some including several proposals on different subjects.

The Colors of Peace is the theme of the next IFCM World Symposium on Choral Music. The 'colors' symbolize the pluralism of international choral life. Various choral structures and sounds, educational models, training and management, conducting and composition techniques will be the essence of the concerts, workshops, lectures and roundtables presented during the Symposium. In building a world of 'peace', choral music plays a fundamental role encouraging harmony, listening and mutual respect, joining forces and wills with solidarity and the mingling of different cultures. We want to contribute to this noble goal with the help of the most human expression of music: singing! Together with a selection of the best choral experts from around the world you'll explore:

- The connection between the past and the present in choral creativity
- How can conductors continue to learn and what is that?
- Who builds the choir and how?

### NORDKLANG16 AUGUST 3-7, 2016 IN TURKU, FINLAND

The Nordklang Festival is organized under the umbrella of Nordisk Korforum every three years in one of the Nordic countries. The event brings together singers from all the Nordic countries to sing, learn and network.

Nordklang16 will offer a large variety of workshops for singers of all kinds of choirs.

### **Vocal Jazz** — **Jesper Holm** (for intermediate to difficult level)

"How do we make that marvellous jazz sound in a choir?" Vocal big band, and music inspired by The Singers Unlimited in Jesper Holm's arrangements. The focus will be on the elements that are particular to vocal jazz: Harmonic complexity, swing feeling, jazz phrasing, sound & blend, big band imitation. Get into the groove with the Danish specialist Jesper Holm. Mr. Jesper Holm is educated in both classical and rhythmic choral conducting. He works as a lecturer at the Royal Danish Academy of Music in rhythmic choral conducting and ensemble singing/jazz choir. He is also an avid instructor at many events and festivals in Denmark and abroad. Mr. Holm is a passionate vocal jazz enthusiast. He is the conductor/arranger for the vocal jazz group Touché. The ensemble often participates in Mr. Holm's workshops to demonstrate the intricacies of vocal jazz. Mr. Holm has performed in e.g. the World Symposium on Choral Music and Vocal Jazz Summit, Mainz, and has frequently shared the stage with groups like The Danish Radio Big Band, The Swingle Singers and The Real Group.

### Folk Music for Choir — Ilona Korhonen (for easy to intermediate level)

Folk singer and choral conductor Ilona Korhonen will lead you into the sounds of folk singing from around the Baltic Sea. If your idea of folk music is folk costumes, folk dances and romantic folk song arrangements, this is not the group for

you. But if you want to find out how we can bring the ideals, style and texts of folk singing into vibrant modern performances, this might just be your thing! Ilona Korhonen is a female musician, dedicated to the bone to folk music, and involved in all kinds of music, mostly vocal. Ms. Korhonen is familiar with many aspects of a musician's work: composing, ensemble playing, producing, singing, teaching, researching and working as a consultant. Before turning completely to folk music, Ms. Korhonen studied at the Sibelius Academy Department of Music Education to become a secondary school and upper secondary school music teacher and did plenty of studies in choir conducting and pedagogy. In 2007, she was accepted to study at the Department of Folk Music, and she became Master of Music in 2003. The subject of Ms. Korhonen's doctoral dissertation, accepted with honours in the summer 2012, was Ingrian runo-singing, focusing on solo runo-singing. Another field Ms. Korhonen has studied extensively is polyphony and choir singing in its many forms. As a part of her doctoral dissertation, she composed and performed an hour-long female choir piece based on Ingrian polyphony, "Tarkka pää, tania mieli", with her own ensemble. ## FAYHA CHOIR, NOMINATED BY ECA-EC, WINS IMC MUSIC RIGHTS AWARD

We are proud to report that the Fayha choir, member of ECA-EC and IFCM, has been selected as the laureate of the 2015 IMC Music Rights Awards. The award was handed over in Rabat, Morocco, on November 11th 2015, during the opening concert of the music market "Visa for Music".

The Fayha was nominated by ECA-EC because of the extensive social work the choir has been doing over the last years, especially in the field of singing with refugee children, but also setting up school choirs, bringing Muslim and Christian young people peacefully together in one choir, offering learning opportunities to young people in the region and last but not least, organizing the first International Lebanese Choir festival for the promotion of peace and understanding. The jury of the Music Rights Awards of the International Music Council, chaired by Gary Ingle (USA), recognized the extraordinary work the Fayha Choir has been doing for many years in Lebanon, often under difficult circumstances, promoting choral music as an art form but also as a social tool.

There are two exciting events that ACDA will be a part of in the coming year.

The first will be the seven division conferences taking place in February and March of 2016. These conferences will feature highlights such as Voces8, a vocal ensemble from England that "[Voces8] is now established as one of the most versatile and best-loved singing groups", world renowned composer Ola Gjeilo (who is the composer in residence for

Voces8) and many amazing choral and orchestral ensembles performing the works of Bach, Verdi and Howell to name just a few. These division conferences will take place in Chicago (Central), Boston (Eastern), Sioux Falls (North Central), Seattle (Northwestern), Chattanooga (Southern), Kansas City (Southwestern) and Pasadena (Western). The second event, one in which ACDA has partnered with the Organización America Cantat, is the America Cantat VIII festival to be held from August 21-31, 2016 in the Bahamas. This festival is the premier cultural music festival of the Americas, and is the only non-competitive choir festival to unite, singers, conductors, and festival choirs from North, Central and South America in a ten-day cultural and musical immersion program. America Cantat is modeled after its sister festival, Europa Cantat. These festivals, in conjunction with Africa Cantat and Asia Pacific Cantat, constitute a worldwide movement of promoting peace and understanding through intercultural and artistic events. Performances at the festival will feature some of the best vocal ensembles that the Americas have to offer. ### **RIP Jonathan Harvey**

Celebrated British composer Jonathan Harvey died, aged 73, on December 6. His publisher, Faber Music, confirmed that Harvey, who had been suffering from motor-neurone disease for some time, died peacefully in Sussex, UK. "His impact as a composer has been profound and international in its scope. The spirituality of his music also pervaded his personality; no one who met him came away without commenting on his gentleness, generosity and breadth of imagination ... Music simply poured out of him, naturally and organically. In every sense he was a superior human being and one that it has been a privilege to know, as much as it has been a delight to treasure his music." Sally Cavender, vice-chairman of Faber Music.
