Announcing World Choral Day, 8 December 2024

IFCM Online Café: Creating Choral Music — Talking about the Requirements of Choral Repertoire

Saturday, 9 November 2024, online, 4pm CET

This IFCM Online Café is open to all. It will focus on the art of choral composition. Three well-known Latin American composers will share their ideas on how to create choral music for ensembles today, using their own compositions as illustrations.

To explore this theme, IFCM invited these three composers from Latin America:

- **César Alejandro Carrillo** (Venezuela). Venezuelan composer, arranger, and choral conductor, César has performed in Europe, Asia, and America. He has received many awards for his work as a composer and has also been a jury member, workshop leader, and speaker at various local and international venues. He wrote the book *Música Sacra - Guía de textos latinos traducidos al español*. He conducted the *Orfeón Universitario* of the Central University of Venezuela from 1992 to 2012 and is currently the conductor of *Cantarte* and the founder and arranger of *Bolanegra*.
- **Julio César Morales Pineda** (Mexico). Julio is currently a choral director in the Community Choir Program of the Veracruz Institute of Culture and director/arranger of *Vox A Cappella Band*, a vocal group with many tours abroad. A tenor, he performs with *Exigence*, a professional ensemble with singers from various nationalities and *Los Bordershop Quartet*, the first bi-national barbershop group. His music has been premiered and awarded in many countries.
- **Mónica Pacheco** (Argentina). Mónica founded the Children's Choir of the Municipality of Mza (1985) and the Choir of AMICANA (1986), which she still conducts. In 2007, she started ARTE VOCAL Experimental Group of Cámara, an ensemble which mixes art forms in unusual places. In addition to conducting the Mendoza Philharmonic and researching interdisciplinary

- **Marie Herrington** (USA). Marie is a Ukrainian-American soprano, composer and music director. She is the winner of the IFCM Composition Competition 2023-2024. She will present her winning piece *A Jelly-Fish* with two other choral pieces.
- **Jaakko Mäntyjärvi** (Finland). Jaakko is a professional freelance translator and composer as well as an amateur and semi-professional choral singer and conductor. He is one of Finland's internationally best-known composers of choral music with a catalog of 150 works published to date.
- **Eva Ugalde** (Basque Country, Spain). With an intimate relationship with the choral world, Eva Ugalde began writing music for raw voices encouraged by Javier Busto, one of the pioneers of the new wave of composers that flourished at the end of the 20th century. She's regularly invited as jury member at prestigious international composition competitions around the world.

[Music at the End of the World Foundation](#) was founded in 2012 to provide an institutional framework for the *Coro del Fin del Mundo*. From its beginning, the foundation has promoted intense, high-quality musical activities in the region and has been instrumental in creating the *Ensamble del Fin del Mundo*, *Coral Makus*, *Coro de Niños del Fin del Mundo*, and the *Voces del Fuego choir*. Since 2019, it has been organizing the *End of the World Choir Festival*, aiming to foster artistic and pedagogical excellence. In 2021, the foundation achieved the enactment of Provincial Law No. 1363 (Promotion of Choral Activity) for the development of local choirs. Since its inception, it has been working towards the creation of the first School of Music in Tierra del Fuego.

[Daniel Reuss](#), internationally-renowned conductor (Capella Amsterdam, Rias kammerchor, Ensemble vocal de Lausanne) will be the artistic director, with a program including composers

from all over Europe (Vaughan-Williams, Vasks, Ligeti, Schnittke, Martin), traditional repertoire, and a world première.

The session will be hosted by the [Federació Catalana d'Entitats Corals](#) (FCEC). The rehearsal session will be in Catalonia and the concert tour will be in Spain (Barcelona, Madrid, Alcala de Henares) and France, including performances at Festival de Prades Pablo Casals and [Choralies](#) in Vaison-la-Romaine.

The choir will be composed of 64 young singers (ages 18-26) from all over the world who are interested in improving their choral singing skills and are passionate, experienced, high-level choral singers or soloists. For application information, see [here](#).

On 21 September 2024, the African Confederation for Choral Music and the Africa Cantat Festival organized a webinar on the topic: "Exploring the Legacy of Shalati Joseph Khosa in



African Choral Music". [Shalati Joseph Khosa](#) grew up in a musical family in South Africa and began arranging and embellishing hymns and traditional pieces at the age of six. By the time he was fourteen, Shalati Joseph had composed several songs that were performed by church and school choirs.

This webinar explored Shalati Joseph Khosa's legacy in the African choral music repertoire, with insights from Nyiko Condry Ngobeni, a South African researcher.
