WSCM 2026 MACAU China, 23-28 August 2026, Reimagining the Future

The World Symposium on Choral Music (WSCM) 2026 – “Reimagining the Future” – held in Macau, China has come to a successful conclusion. WSCM 2026 featured 12 invited choirs and eight ‘World Voices’ participating choirs, 58 invited presenters, a total of 700 participants and distinguished guests from 48 countries. Musically and culturally diverse concerts, keynote presentations, workshops and sessions, conducting masterclasses, and an Expo all showcased the richness of our choral world, challenging everyone to “Grow your network, grow your voice, grow your future.” The artistic excellence and inspirational ideas of these world-class choirs and presenters, along with connections forged between the many choral musicians present, were all key contributors in our quest to reimagine that future.

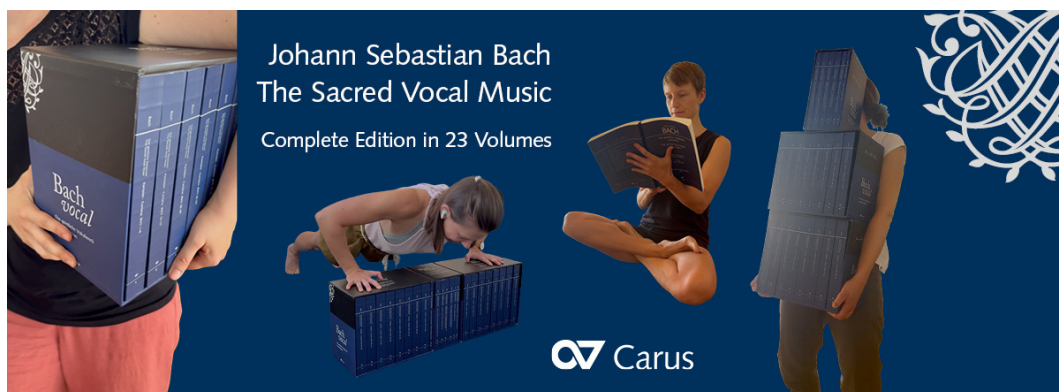

The 2026 Alberta programme centres on workforce development, and how cities build, retain and invest in the music professionals and creative enterprises that power local economies. Through panels, fireside chats, hackathons, presentations and collective thinking sessions, delegates will explore the talent pipeline, job creation, education and training, business attraction and retention, Indigenous music economies, music tourism, health and wellbeing, and the future of music policy across AI, climate action and land use.

1st Competition of Choral Compositions in Indigenous Languages

Ancient voices intertwine with contemporary music. Fomento al Canto Coral Mexicano (FCCM), INALI, and the Ministry of Culture proudly present the 1st Choral Composition Competition in Mexican Native Languages (Isthmus Zapotec).

This global call invites composers worldwide to create unpublished choral works. Language fluency is not required; a digital library of authorized texts and a virtual IPA phonetics workshop will be provided. [Submissions](#) are open from August 15 to December 15, 2026. Entry fees are \$250 MXN (Mexicans) / €20 (foreigners).

Three winners will join FCCM's catalogue, and the first place will premiere at the 5th Mexico-Canada Encounter in Oaxaca.
