WORLD SYMPOSIUM ON CHORAL MUSIC (WSCM) IN ISTANBUL (25-30 April 2023) Message from Chair of the Artistic Committee, Jan Schumacher, and Administrative Committee, Ki Adams

The **2023 World Symposium on Choral Music** – *Changing Horizons* has just concluded in Istanbul, Türkiye! With support from the Republic of Türkiye Ministry of Culture and Tourism and IFCM, we were able to organize a truly international celebration of collective singing. With guest choirs, invited presenters, and participants from over 60 countries, our time together was a musical and cultural extravaganza. It was a gathering characterized by artistic brilliance and excellence, musical and cultural diversity and exchange, and a dynamic pursuit of knowledge and understanding. Through concerts, keynote presentations, conducting and composer masterclasses, meet-the-composer sessions, open singing, reading sessions, panels, roundtables, lounges, and the EXPO, there was something for everyone!

Changing Horizons, the theme for WSCM 2023, speaks both to the specific IFCM flagship event and to the global choral community on a number of levels. It suggests a new and broader understanding of choral music that includes styles, regions, and traditions of ensemble singing which may have been excluded previously from the conventional definition of choral music. There is enormous creative wealth in these parallel artistic expressions and experiences that has the potential to enrich the evolution of collective singing. To change the horizon is to take our art form and extend its boundaries. The horizon limits our own vision, but horizons need not be stagnant; beyond them, there will always be more to discover.

During our six days together, our community experienced, celebrated, and interrogated the choral landscape around the world. What does it look like at the present and what might/ could it look like in the future? Together, we opened ourselves to experiencing and valuing a different aesthetic in group singing. We created spaces in which we were challenged in our own practice at some level. Hopefully, in this crazy world, the 2023 Symposium program managed to 'change' personal horizons as well, supplying new energy and purpose as we individually bring the power of choral singing to our own countries and communities. Peace and understanding begin with us conductors as individuals who have the agency and responsibility to lead and inspire those connected with us. To quote Barack Obama: *Change will not come if we wait for some other person, or if we wait for some other time. We are the ones we've been waiting for. We are the change that we seek.*

OBITUARY: DR. HERBERT ROYCE SALTZMAN

IFCM is deeply saddened about the passing of our dear friend and Honorary Member, Royce Saltzman, in Eugene, Oregon, USA, on 3 April 2023, in his 95th year. Royce was a conductor, an educator, the Co-Founder/Executive Director of the Oregon Bach Festival, President of ACDA (1979-1981), and Founding Member and President of IFCM (1985-1993). He was a generous, creative, and enthusiastic choral leader and a man of long-term vision and positive action whose diplomacy and wisdom combined with his networks and exchange spaces created an incredibly significant legacy for the universal choral family and for future generations.

"Royce's commitment to IFCM started in 1979 when he met a group of choral leaders determined to create an international organization that would facilitate cooperation and exchange between choirs, educational institutions, and national organizations. In 1981, at the national ACDA Convention in New Orleans, Royce initiated a choral summit, attended by leaders from thirteen countries. The group addressed issues such as touring, education, the sharing of information and materials, but foremost, the possibility of establishing an international organization that would facilitate cooperation and exchange. Royce then chaired an interim committee that met in Loughborough, England, to establish statutes, choose a name that would represent its global outreach, and determine Founding Organizations, which would provide support and validity to this fledging alliance. Thus, in 1982, the child IFCM was born." *

This child is now 41 years old. Thank you, Royce! May your life and legacy inspire many choral leaders around the world.

MUSICA INTERNATIONAL

Have you considered organizing a concert around the theme of the Four Elements (air, water, fire, earth)?

Musica International database (www.musicanet.org or https://www.ifcm.net/service/ access-to-musica-international-database for IFCM members) is an ideal resource for building a concert program around a given theme, particularly because the database is developed as a collaborative project in which all choral musicians are invited to participate. As Musica International is a structured database, conductors can obtain specific, targeted responses by combining multiple and different search criteria.

As an example, Musica International suggested the Four Elements theme in its recent newsletter (<u>https://www.musicanet.org/musicamail/202303/202303_en.html</u>) and invited everyone to share their favorite pieces which might fit within a Four Elements themed program. Here is a sampling of the proposals received:
