### **IFCM GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND ELECTIONS 2020**

The International Federation for Choral Music (IFCM) held its General Assembly on 25 April 2023. Prior to the General Assembly, the election of the new Board of Directors was organized fully online (1 March – 1 April 2023). We can proudly say that this event has an historical significance in our association since this was the first time all individual IFCM members had the opportunity to vote individually, due to a change in the Bylaws approved at the General Assembly in Lisbon in September 2022. Other election changes include more democratic representation (votes) for the following member organizations: choirs (2 votes), local organizations (3 votes), national and regional organizations (10 votes), and international organizations (20 votes).

The election of the new Board of Directors was organized through an online voting system. An election committee was appointed to overlook the process and ensure fair and democratic results. The results were announced during the General Assembly, and, on 28 April 2023, the new Board named its Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and Governance Advisor.

### **CALL FOR THE YOUNG IFCM FOR THE 2023-2026 TERM**

The idea for creating the Youth Committee of the International Federation for Choral Music came after a successful program for young choral and cultural managers. In 2022 during the World Choral EXPO in Lisbon, Portugal, IFCM organized its first YOUNG program - Youth International Cultural Management program. Following the interest of young people who applied for the program and their input, hard work, and personal and professional growth during the event, the Board of Directors of IFCM decided to form a YOUNG IFCM - youth committee. With this committee, IFCM wants to offer young people worldwide a chance to **learn**, **expand** and **exchange** their knowledge and **develop** in the field of choral music and choral management by including them in the very heart of the federation. This strategy aims to set up the basic borders and rules of forming a youth committee of IFCM, but also its objectives, works, coordination, organization, governance, and evaluation.

IFCM is opening a call for **The YOUNG IFCM for the term 2023-2026**. Qualified applicants for this term are those born not earlier than 18 June 1994 and not later than 17 June 2005. We are looking for up to 8 (eight) young people aged 18 to 28 representing eight regions of the world recognized by IFCM Bylaws and Membership Policy document:

- North America
- Latin America and the Caribbean
- Sub-Saharan Africa
- Middle East and North Africa
- Northern & Western Europe and Israel
- Central-Eastern & South-Eastern Europe
- Asia (Central, East and South)
- Oceania (Australia, New Zealand, South Pacific)

ones proposed by Musica, you will benefit from discussing the pieces with peers (difficulties, keys, liturgical use, keywords, pronunciation of the text, etc.), and you will receive on-the-spot help from the Musica International team. You will also find new repertoire ideas and learn how to optimize your usage of the Musica database for building your future concert programs. Why not also using the opportunity to promote the choral repertoire from your country or region? The workshop takes place on the campus of the Strasbourg University where the working space has a view on the **Strasbourg Cathedral**, one of the finest examples of Rayonnant Gothic architecture in the world!



After the workshop, you can continue using Musica online in order to find repertoire ideas, to add new descriptive records of choral works, and to manage your own musical library.

There is no tuition fee. Participants are responsible for their own transportation and accommodation costs.

### A CŒUR JOIE INTERNATIONAL

<u>A Coeur Joie International</u> (ACJI) is organizing its first composition competition for mixed voices based on French texts – *Chanter en français*. Open to composers from all over the world without any restrictions, the competition offers 3,000 euros in prizes.

The objective of the competition is to promote the creation of new works in French that are accessible to amateur choirs throughout the international network of ACJI. As well, this initiative demonstrates the strong commitment of ACJI to safeguarding and enriching the cultural heritage that includes choral repertoire in all its French-speaking and international diversity.

The winning works will have the possibility of being published by Editions A Cœur Joie France as well as being performed at concerts organized through initiatives of the federation's members. Deadline to submit: **31 December 2023**.

### **EUROPEAN CHORAL ASSOCIATION (ECA)**

The first environmental strategy and policies of the European Choral Association is now available online

At the end of March 2023, the European Choral Association published its first environmental sustainability strategy and policies based on the guidelines developed in the frame of the **SHIFT Project** (2019-2022), coordinated by the **European Music Council** and co-funded by the EU **Erasmus+ programme**. ECA was a partner in this project in which the process for the SHIFT Eco Certificate for European cultural networks was begun.

In autumn 2020, the membership of ECA approved a new vision, mission, strategy, and action plan. The topic of environmental sustainability was explicitly mentioned under the first strategic aim. With the start of the project IGNITE in December 2021, ECA began working concretely on how the sector of collective singing can contribute to environmental sustainability and to the European Green Deal.

We understand that we are at the very beginning of a long path and that there is still a lot to do. Yet we also know that there is urgency and that we have to start now. As ECA, we have decided to set an example for the sector and to start with ourselves.

One week later, the celebrations will continue in Budapest, Hungary, at the <a href="Ith European Forum on Music">11th European Forum on Music</a> (EFM), 8-10 June 2023. All EMC members are kindly invited to join the EFM 2023.
