#### **World Choral Day 2024**

The <u>European Choral Association</u>, with the support of <u>Choral TIES</u> and in collaboration with the <u>International Federation for Choral Music</u>, is launching a call for young international cultural managers to be part of the Pueri Cantores 2025 team and to broaden their experience and skills while working closely with the organising team.

#### Conditions of participation:

- · The whole program will be in English.
- · There is no participation fee.
- Selected participants will have some availability for online meetings with the local team in the months leading up to the event.

#### Munich, Germany, 16-20 July 2025

Approximately 5,000 young people from all over the world are expected to attend the **Pueri Cantores International Choir Festival** in Munich on 16-20 July 2025. Under the motto: Cantate Domino - polyphonic for peace - #comeandsing, the program includes a festival of nations on Munich's Marienplatz, mother-tongue services in the inner-city churches, prayers for peace, and concerts in churches, concert venues, and social institutions throughout the archdiocese. The festival is organized by a specially founded association and supported by the Archdiocese of Munich and Freising. Cardinal Reinhard Marx, Archbishop of Munich and Freising, and Ilse Aigner, President of the Bavarian State Parliament, are the patrons of the festival.




#### Registration now open until 31 January 2024.




## Watch the Webinar "Creating Choral Music — Talking about the requirements of choral repertoire" which took place on Zoom on 23 November 2024

### Conductors Beyond Borders with Schola Cantorum de Venezuela in Mérida and San Cristóbal, Venezuela

#### ¡Cantemos! con La Schola, 20-24 November 2024

Following their first program *¡Cantemos!* on the Margarita Island, the <u>Schola Cantorum de Venezuela</u>, conducted by Maria Guinand and Luimar Arismendi, brought their program to yet another part of Venezuela. This time to Mérida and San Cristóbal. *¡Cantemos!* Is designed to encourage the participation and development of more choral groups through meetings, workshops, seminars and concerts. The program included:

- · Workshops on body expression, vocal techniques, and choral repertoire
- · Choral conducting basic technique, eurhythmics, and rehearsal strategies
- · Gala concerts and concerts with regional choirs



#### **Audition now for the World Youth Choir Session 2025**

#### Catalonia, Spain, 13 July - 1 August 2025, with Daniel Reuss, conductor

All eligible singers (ages between 18 and 26 on July 1, 2025) who have never participated in the <u>World Youth Choir</u> (along with eligible singers from sessions prior to 2017) should apply in their home country through a national audition process. National auditions with a national jury will be organized by national recruiting institutions/organisations (music organisations, choral organisations, universities, music schools, conductors, music teachers, etc.).

General application deadline: **22 December 2024.** Note: National juries will have earlier deadlines.

This 2025 session of the World Youth Choir is organized by the Federació Catalana d'Entitats Corals (FCEC). With a rehearsal period in Catalonia, the concert tour will be in Spain (Barcelona, Madrid, Alcala de Henare) and France with a performance at Choralies in Vaison-la-Romaine.

#### Berkshire Choral International (BCI) opens 2025 Apprentice applications

<u>Applications</u> are open for Berkshire Choral International's two free educational programs for undergraduate and graduate level music students.

- BCI's Frank Nemhauser Apprentice Program is a free program designed for career-track singers and choral conductors enrolled in undergraduate or advanced degree programs. Apprentice opportunities in Summer 2025 include:
  - Amherst, Massachusetts (Haydn, Brahms, and Runestad with Conductor Rob Istad, Professor of Music and Director of Choral Studies at California State University);
  - Washington DC (Sing *Considering Matthew Shepard* at the Washington National Cathedral with Conductor Jeffrey Benson, Director of Choral Activities at San José State University);
  - Berlin, Germany (Mozart's Requiem and Bernstein's Chichester Psalms with Jenny Wong, San Francisco Symphony Chorus Director and the Associate Artistic Director of the Los Angeles Master Chorale).
  - Each week-long program is an intensive choral experience providing apprentices with the opportunity to study and rehearse major choral-orchestral works with eminent conductors, faculty, and vocal soloists.
- BCI's Vocal Scholar Program is a free educational opportunity focusing on undergraduate or advanced degree music students who sing tenor or bass voice parts. Applicants do not need to be voice majors but should be enrolled in a music degree program and possess solid vocal technique and reading skills.

BCI is committed to creating and maintaining a diverse and inclusive experience for choral singers. African-American, Latinx, Asian/Pacific Islander, Indigenous, and LGBTQ+ identified students are strongly encouraged to apply.
