China International Chorus Festival, Beijing, China

The 17th China International Choral Festival (CICF) was held in Beijing, China, 15-19 July 2024. IFCM President, Emily Kuo Vong, attended the opening and closing concerts, award ceremony, and other events. CICF is one of the biggest festivals in the world, with 306 choirs and over 15,000 singers from 31 countries around the globe. The five-day festival was meticulously planned and presented six major thematic components, including performance activities, evaluation displays, exhibition exchanges, educational training, seminar exchanges, and choral philanthropy. In total, there were 13 events featuring an impressive 212 performances and exchange activities.

Qiandongnan International Folk Song Festival and World Voices Conference, 20-24 July 2024

The 2024 Qiandongnan International Folk Song Festival and World Voices Conference opened in Zhaoxing Dong Village on 21 July 2024. Situated in the Guizhou Province, Zhaoxing is one of the largest Dong minority villages in China. Dong singers joined the invited international choirs for the opening ceremony followed by a communal meal on one of the village's beautiful large terraces, concluding a day of sharing, discovery, and music-making. The invited choirs had the great opportunity to immerse themselves in the Dong and Miao culture while visiting the beautiful Zhenyuan Ancient Town, sailing along the gorgeous Wuyang River, sampling local





cuisine, meeting the Miao Minority villagers in Qianhu Miao Village, and tasting Miao family food. They also engaged in collaborative songwriting and learning new repertoire.

IFCM is thankful for this collaboration with the China Qiandongnan International Folk Song Festival and the Guizhou Ethnic Song Culture Media.

World Youth Choir Alumni Session at Harbour VOICES! International Festival of Collective Singing Traditions

The <u>World Youth Choir</u> is back home after an incredible Alumni Session 2024 in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador, Canada, hosted by <u>HarbourVOICES! International</u> Festival of Collective Singing Traditions.

The choir, featuring 32 talented singers from 24 countries (Argentina, Canada, Germany, Ghana, Guatemala, Hong Kong SAR, Indonesia, Iran, Ireland, Japan, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Norway, Philippines, Russia, Serbia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, The Netherlands, Taiwan, United States of America, and Venezuela), performed under the artistic direction of Cecilia Rydinger (Sweden). Cecilia reflects on the session:

One of the most fantastic experiences and collaborations throughout my entire life as a choral conductor. Us all sharing great music making and strong expressions, together with lots of joy and laughter, during this amazing festival, with its theme of inclusiveness and humanity in the foreground. Thank you so much Mr Ki Adams, President of the WYC Foundation, IFCM Board Member, and one of the Artistic Directors for the festival, for bringing us there. Unforgettable! The choir showcased celebrated classical choral works and explored rich musical traditions from Scandinavian and Canadian Indigenous cultures. The singers were honored to meet and learn from Andrew Balfour, Hussein Janmohamed, and André de Quadros, who shared powerful stories of overcoming exclusion and hardship. A highlight of this session was collaborating with the Indigenous children of Ullugiâgatsuk Youth Choir (Labrador) on Andrew Balfour's "Four Directions" piece. The festival's headliner, Jacob Collier, led a fantastic 3-hour workshop on his piece "World, O World," culminating in an unforgettable performance at the Gala Concert where the 1400 singers were conducted by Jacob himself! What an inspiring and transformative experience!



Asia Pacific Youth Choir 2024 in Daegu, South Korea

The <u>Asia Pacific Youth Choir</u> took place 14)20 July 2024 in Daegu, South Korea. It was led by two highly experienced conductors: Jacob Youngmok Chang, President of the Korea International Choral Association and Former President of Daegu Art University, and Mark Anthony Carpio, a renowned choral conductor, countertenor, and the choirmaster of the Philippine Madrigal Singers from the Philippines.

The APYC organizers were thrilled to bring together 32 young talented singers from all over Asia-Pacific region. They came from China (2), Hong Kong SAR (2), India (1), Indonesia (5), Japan (1), Malaysia (6), New Zealand (2), Philippines (4), Singapore (1), Taiwan (2), Thailand (4) and South Korea (2).

The singers rehearsed for three days at Yeungnam University College, living at the university's Global House. For some songs, performances were accompanied by piano, oboe and chamber orchestra.

The APYC performed at the Daegu Concert House, a world-class professional concert venue and classical music establishment situated in Daegu, a UNESCO Creative City of Music, and at Dalseogu Senior Welfare Center.

Kati Yetu! The African Youth Choir singers met at their Summer Camp, Island of Gorée, Dakar, Senegal, 22-28 July 2024

Kati Yetu means 'between us' in Swahili. During seven days, 22-28 July 2024, 23 singers from seven countries (Benin, Cameroon, DR Congo, Gabon, Gambia, Ivory Coast, Senegal) met and sang under the direction of Jean Benoit Bakhoum (Senegal), the new African Youth Choir conductor (2024-2025) who is succeeding to Ken Wakia (Kenya) and Pierre Kouame (Ivory Coast), 2019-2023 conductors.



The repertoire included ten new, unpublished pieces. The singers were asked to completely master the repertoire prior to their arrival at the camp. American Choral Directors Association: International Conductors Exchange Program With the Philippine Choral Directors Association in 2025

The <u>International Conductors Exchange Program</u> (ICEP) provides opportunities for the rising generation of choral leaders to represent the United States as ambassadors to the world in the exchange of music, ideas, and cultures. Established in 2010 and coordinated by ACDA's International Activities Committee, the program has connected choral conductors in the United States with counterparts in Cuba, China, Sweden, South Korea, Argentina, Brazil, Costa Rica, Guatemala, Mexico, Uruguay, Kenya, South Africa, and Germany.

ACDA & the Philippine Choral Directors Association (PCDA) are pleased to announce that, in 2025, the International Conductors Exchange Program will be in partnership with conductors and choirs in the Philippines. In 2024, six American and six Filipino conductors will be selected to participate in a bilateral, mutual exchange to take place in 2025. Conductors will be paired based on backgrounds and interests and will visit each other's choral communities, sharing techniques, and learning best practices.

Residencies in the United States will be centered around the **2025 ACDA National Conference** (18-21 March 2025 in Dallas, Texas, USA).



Bandung Choral Society announces its 14th Bali International Choir Festival (BICF)

The <u>14th</u> <u>Bali International Choir Festival</u> 29 July-2 August 2025 provides a range of services and resources for choirs and solo singers, including clinics and workshops, evaluation performances, friendship concerts, and competitions in several categories.

The BICF is part of the **Asia Choral Grand Prix**. Founded in 2019, the Asia Choral Grand Prix is an annual competition between the Grand Champions of four Asian choral events: the **Andrea O. Veneracion International Choral Festival** (Philippines), the **Singapore International Choral Festival**, the **Bali International Choir Festival** (Indonesia) and the **Malaysian Choral Eisteddfod**.
