YOUNG, Youth International Cultural Management Programme 2025

After the great success of the two previous <u>YOUNG programmes</u> (World Choral EXPO 2022 and WSCM 2023 in Istanbul), IFCM launched a call for young leaders to take part in the third YOUNG programme in the framework of the 45th International Congress of Pueri Cantores, Munich, Germany (16-20 July 2025).

IFCM has received 37 applications from 19 different countries. The selection committee, made up of members of the International Federation Pueri Cantores, the European Choral Association and IFCM (IFCM YOUNG), will meet to select the candidates that will best fit the festival's programme. Their names will be announced in the next IFCMeNEWS.



Call for Choirs to Apply for Conductors Beyond Borders Peer-to-Peer Exchange Programme

The Conductors Beyond Borders Peer-to-Peer Exchange Programme is a component of the Choral TIES project coordinated by the **European Choral Association**, co-funded by the **European Union**, and organised in cooperation with IFCM. This programme provides limited

financial support in the form of a grant to cover international travel expenses.

There are three possible options for participation:

- A European conductor may be invited by a choir from a different continent to work on a specific programme for a specific period.
- A conductor from the European Union may be invited by a choir outside the European Union to work on a specific programme for a specific period.
- A conductor from the European Union may invite a conductor from outside the European Union (in Europe or from another continent) to work on a specific programme for a specific period.

This programme is designed to facilitate the internationalization of careers.

On 23-26 January 2025, the International Jury of the World Youth Choir (WYC), together with the conductor of the <u>2025 session</u> (<u>Daniel Reuss</u>) and the session manager, met to review all audition submissions and select the singers who will take part in the session hosted by the **Federació Catalana d'Entitats Corals** (FCEC) in July 2025.

The WYC Foundation Board also met to discuss the future of the programme, evaluate ongoing projects, and finalise plans for the upcoming session.

One of the WYC's Patrons, <u>Jeunesses Musicales International</u> (JMI) hosted the meetings and offered warm hospitality at their headquarters in Brussels.



Rome Choral Festival, Italy, 21-26 June 2026

The Rome International Choral Festival is one of Rome's premier annual summer music events. The annual festival will feature Mass participation at one of Rome's major basilicas and a formal finale concert at Rome's famed Basilica di Santa Maria degli Angeli e dei Martiri. The festival chorus will include mixed-voice singers and choirs from across North America that will come together to rehearse and perform en masse under the direction of Z. Randall Stroope.



Salzburg Choral Festival, Jubilate Mozart! Austria, 24-28 June 2026

This festival will feature a large chorus consisting of mixed voice choirs performing under the direction of Edith Copley. Three days of festival rehearsals and mingling side-by-side with

singers from a variety of backgrounds will lead festival participants to a grand finale concert in the historic city of Salzburg. János Czifra, Domkapellmeister of the Salzburger Dom, will conduct Mozart's *Mass in C Major, "Coronation," KV 317*, accompanied by the Salzburger Domorchester.



Concerts-Austria: Misatango in Paris, 22-26 April 2025, a few seats left!

The <u>Misatango Festival</u> offers individuals and choirs the opportunity to sing *Misa a Buenos Aires* (Misatango) together with the Argentinian composer Martín Palmeri and choirs from all over the world in one the most wonderful venues in Paris 2025.

Both composer Martín Palmeri and conductor Saul Zaks were born in Buenos Aires and have been friends for a long time; both are renowned artists and have been awarded prizes and accolades for their work. Together with Martín and Saul, participants will rehearse and perform for the audience in Paris.
